History

Charles Hullt was Born in 1850 in Sweden. Died 16th July 1889 in West Kempsey and interred 18th July 1889 in Blackbutt Cemetery, Macksville in an unmarked grave.

Married 2nd February 1882 in Sydney to Harriett Lavina Stuart, born 1864, Balmain Sydney NSW, died 11th October 1936, Macksville Buried in the Anglican Cemetery, Macksville
